Course Summary: Asia Workshop is a dynamic working space where students and instructors collaborate to discuss emerging issues in Asia. Topics for discussion change every year to keep up with developments on both regional and global scales.

For this year, Asia Workshop collaborate with EBA Program (Asia and Pacific university collaboration for Evidence Based Approach Project) to design a unique learning experience for students who are interested in solving social problems and fieldwork activities. The EBA Project (<https://eba.soi.asia/>) was created based on EBA Consortium which was supported by the “Re-Inventing Japan Project” of the Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology (MEXT) of Japan from 2012 to 2017. EBA’s activities are now operated by SOI Asia (<https://www.soi.asia/>) and sponsored by APNIC foundation (<https://apnic.foundation/>). EBA has successfully organized numerous fieldworks activities both in Japan and in Southeast countries for both Keio students and students coming from partner universities in Asia.

By joining the Asia Workshop, students will be exposed to critical perspectives of looking at Asia as a whole, engaged in problem-definition exercises—identifying potential problems and exploring possible solutions.

We design fieldwork simulation activities to encourage students to engage in intensive observation of their living environments.

By joining the Asia Workshop, students will have opportunities to join EBA fieldworks activities either in Japan and outside of Japan.

Objectives / Intended Learning Outcome: Students are expected to develop a critical perspective on Asia and the emerging issues within the region. Additionally, they will be equipped with essential field research skills, such as on-site observation and interviewing techniques.
