# I . Dean's Message to the Students of the Master's Program in Taxation Policy and Management

Welcome to the Master's Program in Taxation Policy and Management. This is a successor of the program managed jointly with the World Bank for more than a quarter of century since the mid-1990s which provided master's degrees to more than 100 students from over 35 countries. Then the Graduate School of Business and Commerce decided to run the program independently as the Master's Program in Taxation Policy and Management from fall 2022, and now we are very pleased to receive you for the renewed program.

The Program provides a two-year course which is designed particularly for promising personnel having been and expected to be engaged in tax policy-making and tax administration in developing countries. To make sure that the Program meets the highest possible standards, our faculty members contribute a great deal of their time and expertise. The National Tax College also extends close cooperation to the Program by providing the practicum course where you can study together with students from other universities.

Studying in a foreign country is not so easy at all. You will have to keep studying while trying to adjust yourselves to the social environments and the climate unfamiliar to you. If you work hard through the two-year program, however, you will surely be able to have obtained not only a master's degree but also valuable experience that will be your life-long assets.

Of course, your life in Keio may not be just studying. Finding good friends and developing your personal network should be one of the privileges of participating in the Program. I hope that you will be able to enjoy a two-year campus life to the maximum extent. Our Graduate School will do its best to help you make your life in Keio as fruitful as possible.

## II . *Program Guide for TPM Students*

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### **A. Program requirements**

The Master's Program in Taxation Policy and Management is a two-year program which offers a degree of Master of Arts in Business and Commerce. For completing the program, students are obliged to fulfill the coursework requirements as well as to write a master's thesis and pass the following thesis defense as explained below. Students who successfully complete the program will be awarded the master's degree.

(Coursework)

Students are required to take all Mandatory Courses with 32 credits in total. Mandatory Courses include Seminar: Advanced Study of Tax Administration (the Practicum) which is provided by the National Tax College. In addition, students are strongly advised to acquire at least 8 credits from Recommendable Courses in order to make full use of the study opportunities offered in the Program. The list of Mandatory Courses and Recommendable Courses are given on next page.

(Thesis)

The program also requires students to write and submit a thesis and pass the following thesis defense. The deadline for registering a thesis title is normally early May in the second year and the deadline for submitting a thesis is normally late June in the second year.

### **B. Curriculum**

In principle each course provides a 90-minute class per week. 2 credits are awarded for successful completion of each course for one term (14 weeks). A student's coursework is evaluated with a grade of S, A, B, C (PASS) and D (FAIL).

Classes of the Specialized subjects and the Seminars are basically designed to provide students with opportunities of making presentations and conducting class discussions based on students' research work. Some Seminars help students develop their thesis work with tutorials provided by teaching staff.

In general courses are provided based on the semester system which allows students to complete each course in one semester. There may be courses, however, which are practically completed in two semesters such as Seminar: Advanced Study of Tax Administration, the details of which are provided directly by the National Tax College.

The main feature of the Program is to offer a wide variety of courses to match various interest of students. Besides the Mandatory and Recommendable Courses mentioned above, with approval of their supervisors, students can take other courses provided by the Graduate School of Business and Commerce as well as those offered by other graduate schools of Mita campus, i.e., Graduate Schools of Economics, Laws, Letters and Human Relations as far as they are provided in English.

### **C. AY2023 Course Descriptions**

Each course has a practical and applied orientation, and relies mainly on Japanese examples and case studies. All courses are conducted in English and taught in the Graduate School of Business and Commerce. The summaries of the courses are given in the syllabus (<https://gslbs.keio.jp/syllabus/search>). When searching the syllabus, you may find multiple courses with the same course title. In that case, please check the course instructor's name on page 4-5.

### 1. Submission of your thesis

(1) Must be in A4 and lengthwise in PDF format.

(2) The title on the cover page shall be written horizontally when you are writing the thesis in English.

### 3. Title of the thesis

The actual title and subtitle of the thesis must be exactly the same as the title submitted to the Office of Student Services. The thesis having a different title is not acceptable, even if the difference is only a punctuation mark. \* Please do not put any quotation marks to the title.

Main services provided (departments in charge)

#### -K-LMS (CanvasLMS)(ITC)

This is system mainly designated to support student’s study. Announcements from lecturers, study materials downloads, reports submission, discussion and return of reports (assignments) are available.

#### -Course Registration (Office of Student Services)

The system allows students to make course registration, additional course registration, course cancellation and application for “No New Registered Courses”. Students can modify the courses during the course registration period.

#### -Confirmation of Registered Courses (Office of Student Services)

The list of registered courses available. Students must confirm that their course registration is done correctly. Students can also find the classrooms for registered courses.

#### -Information on Class Cancellations/Make-up Classes (Office of Student Services)

The list of courses with scheduled cancellation and/or make-up classes is available.

The information is subject to change so please check it regularly for updates.

#### -Confirmation/Change of Address (Office of Student Services)

Students can confirm their/guarantor’s address. Select “Various Changes” at the top menu then click on “Confirmation/Change of Ad-dress”. Please notify any changes immediately from this menu

#### -Certificate issuance service (Office of Student Services)

This service enables students to have their certificates issued from the on-campus certificate issuing machines or multi-printing ma-chines in the convenience stores nationwide.
