

1. Programs

(2) Changing Programs

If students wish to change their Program, they must submit two forms to the Registrar Section of the Academic Affairs Office: The Statement of Reason for Changing Program, and the Application for Changing Program

Submission of the Statement of Reason for Changing Program

Students must write the reason for changing their Program in detail and receive the signature of approval from their Main Research Advisor or Research Advisor, who must be a Graduate School Committee member. After submitting the Statement of Reason for Changing Program, students need to make appointments with both their current and new Graduate School Program Chairpersons. The Registrar Section will report the reason for changing the program to the Graduate School Program Chairpersons.

Submission of the Application for Changing Program

Students must have meetings with their current and new Graduate School Program Chairpersons and receive their seals or signatures on the Application for Changing Program. If the Graduate School Committee approves of the change of program, the Registrar Section will notify the student of their acceptance.

2. Professional Courses

Professional Courses are designed to prepare Master's Program students for highly specialized career paths after graduation, and each course awards a certificate upon its completion. After enrolling in the Graduate School of Media and Governance, Master's Program students can take these courses by applying and meeting the requirements set by the faculty member in charge of each course. 4. Classes Cancellations due to Emergencies or Keio University Events

(1) Class cancellations due to emergencies

In the event of public transportation stoppages and other emergencies

In the event of a natural disaster such as a typhoon, heavy rain, heavy snow or earthquake, public transportation stoppages resulting from a major accident or other cause, and other emergencies in which it is necessary to cancel classes, information will be communicated through keio.jp portal or the Keio University Students website.

Other precautions

In the event that an emergency occurs after classes have begun for the day, the university will deal with the situation by canceling classes or sending students home early. In such cases, be sure to follow the instructions provided by the university via the P.A. system and the above Keio websites.

(2) Class cancellations due to Keio University events

Classes on Waseda-Keio Baseball Game Days

Each year, Waseda-Keio baseball games are held over a weekend in late May or early June in the Spring Semester, and late October or early November in the Fall Semester. In the event that the games extend to the following Monday and beyond, classes for courses offered at the Faculty of Policy Management and the Faculty of Environment and Information Studies, as well as classes for Courses Offered by Research Institutes and Centers held at SFC, may be canceled.

Please note that if a game is held on a Monday or later, information regarding classes will be posted on the Keio University Students website after 8:40 a.m. on that day.
