

Copyright Permission Guidelines for Master's Theses Authors

Shonan Fujisawa Media Center collects and provides master's theses, which are valuable knowledge resources, to promote educational and academic activities. In order to provide master's theses as a library collection, we need to clear legal issues relating to copyright. We kindly ask you to submit the '*Copyright and Consent Form of Master's Thesis*' to put the service into practice.

Please read the below thoroughly before filling out the form. Note the options may be changed later as necessary. We appreciate your cooperation and understanding.

Our Roles in Providing Access to the Master's Theses

◆ Cataloging and indexing

- We catalog and index the theses to enable our patrons to access the bibliographic information of the theses at *SFC List of Theses/Dissertations* or *KOSMOS*.

Note that *SFC List of Theses/Dissertations* is accessible only via Shonan Fujisawa Campus Network.

-The bibliographic information includes the following: author's name, thesis title, number of pages, year of publication, type of master's degree, date of conferral.

◆ Providing access to the full text of the theses

-You may obtain the full text PDF files of the master's theses from *SFC List of Theses/Dissertations*.

- As soon as the theses are added to the List, they become ready to be downloaded or printed out for academic purposes,

◆ Hard copy service

- The theses are subject to the hard copy service including document delivery. Note the service is carried out in accordance with the Copyright Act.

Sometimes there is a valid reason for restricting access to your thesis or prohibiting duplication. You may apply for an embargo using the '*Copyright and Consent Form of Master's Thesis*.'

Privacy Policy

The personal information you provide will be used exclusively for the procedures involving your master's thesis. For more details on our privacy policy, please refer to the websites of Keio University as well as Media Center .

Copyright Laws

The '*Copyright and Consent Form of Master's Thesis*' is intended to deal with the legal issues associated with copying. Although copying of published works is legal as stated in the Article 31 of the Copyright Act of Japan, the rule is not applied to master's theses that are generally considered 'unpublished'. The author's permission is required to copy unpublished works in any form regardless of the quantity. Not even a single page can be copied without permission.
