2. Coursework

- Course subjects: Business, Economics, etc.
- The course list is on the GPP website
 - (<u>Japanese</u>; <u>English</u>)
- You need to complete four courses (8 credits)
- You can take the courses in any semester.

2. Coursework: Important !!!

- Some courses are designed initially for graduate students.
- Please read the syllabus carefully to check if the course requires:
 - Prerequisites (e.g., economics, statistics, etc.)
 - Pre-registration sign-up requirements
- Contact course instructors and Gakuji (Office of Student Service) for questions.
