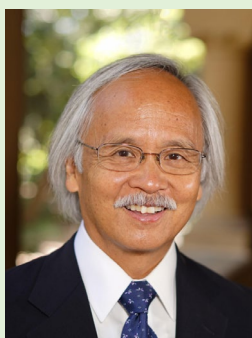

For many decades, Keio University and Stanford University have engaged in numerous sporting events and student and scholarly exchanges. Most recently, on September 15, 2023, 14 Keio students visited Stanford University. The students were participants in Keio's Global Passport Program. Dr. Gary Mukai shared his thoughts on the question, "What Does It Mean to Be a Global Citizen?" with them. He conceptualized his thoughts based on his 46 years as an educator and reflections as a third-generation Japanese American. This lecture will be offered again to a broader audience at Keio University.

Dr. Gary Mukai is Director of the Stanford Program on International and Cross-Cultural Education (SPICE). Prior to joining SPICE in 1988, he was a teacher in Gunma Prefecture, Japan, and in California public schools for ten years. In 2004, SPICE received the Foreign Minister's Commendation from the Japanese government for its promotion of Japanese studies in schools.
